# **Journalism Scavenger Hunt**

Looking at real-world print publications can teach and inspire you as you develop your student publication. Using any news publication website of your choice (ex: washington post, St. Louis Post Dispatch, Chicago Tribune, etc.) answer the following questions.

## HEADLINES

1) Find one headline in the paper that does a good job of conveying the topic of the article. Read the article to be sure. Write that headline below and explain why it worked.

2) Now reread the article you chose from #1. Outline/Summarize the contents of the article paying attention to each of the five Ws and the H (who, what, where, where, why, and how).

3) Most newspaper headlines are more traditional and do not typically employ figurative language. However, there are some times when a journalist will choose a more creative approach. Find a creative headline. Read the article. Write that headline below and explain why the journalist might have made a creative choice. Explain why it worked.

## ARTICLES

4) Find an article where someone is quoted. Put yourself in the shoes of the journalist. What question(s) did he/she pose to obtain that quote. Now evaluate the quote(s) that was included. What did it add to the article?

### **PICTURES & CAPTIONS**

5) Find one picture with a caption. Describe what all is included in the caption package. Is it an effective caption or could there be something added to improve it?

6) Find one article with a picture. Describe the picture. What part of the article does the picture support? Was that an effective choice? Why or why not?

7) Find an article where someone is quoted. Put yourself in the shoes of the journalist. What question(s) did he/she pose to obtain that quote. Now evaluate the quote(s) that was included. What did it add to the article?

### WORDS & LANGUAGE

8) Look for unfamiliar words in the newspaper. Write at least two words. Try to define them using

context clues. Check your definition in a dictionary.

9) Find at least three examples of figurative language. Say where in the paper you found them. Write them below, and explain what type of figurative language each is.
